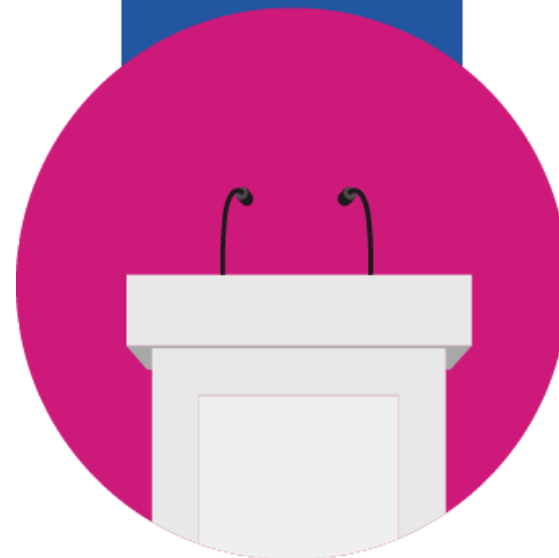

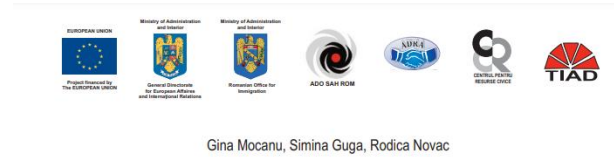

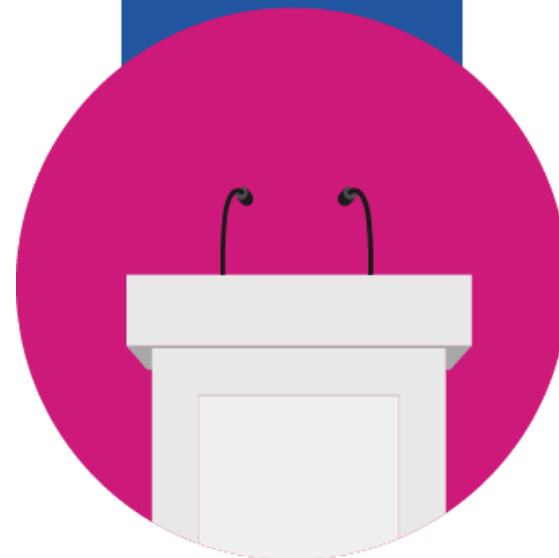

Community action planning process (CAPP)

- CAPP submitted to ActionAid Italy: 31st of Oct 2022.
- Needs assessment from 8 community meetings.
- Local focus groups/consultations/individual interviews.
- These meetings engaged **119 participants**, bringing together diverse perspectives and expertise to emphasize the importance of enhanced public participation and representation of international residents in Cluj.
- Presented as a guide at the first training on How to Organize a Participatory Community Action plan (examples of participation, mobilization, and mapping).



These trainings attracted 70 participants.



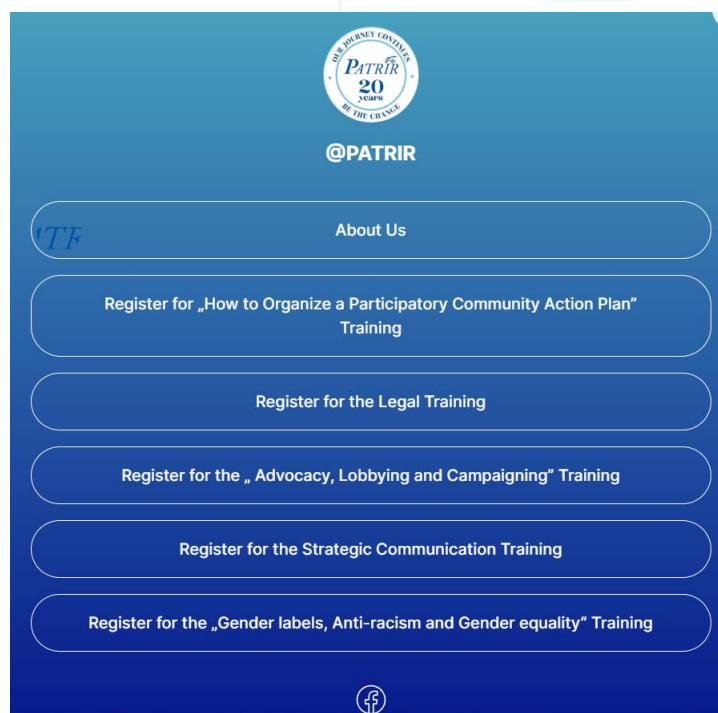

Plan for setting up the migrant council – Registration of the Migrant Council

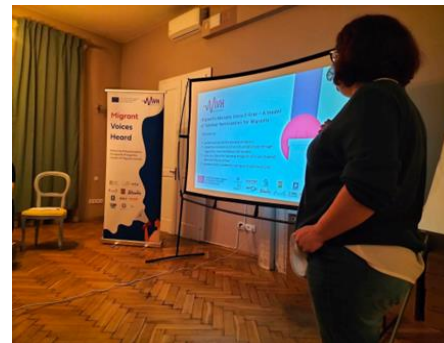
Throughout January to August 2023, there were ten regular meetings with migrants, founding members of the Council and stakeholders, including:

STATUTE

CLUJ INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL ASSOCIATION

ART. 1. On the basis of Law no. 246/2005 and according to the present Statute, the Cluj International Council Association is hereby established.

ART. 2. The Cluj International Council Association is an independent, non-profit legal person of private law, organized according to Law no. 246/2005, whose founding members are:

ART.4. The Cluj International Council Association is a non-governmental, non-profit, independent, public benefit association.

THE OBJECTIVES

Cluj International Council will address migrant and refugees' rights and needs from an inclusive and holistic approach, based on the following objectives:

- To provide first-hand support to international newcomers in Cluj, through information, advice, and best practices examples aimed at facilitating the integration process.
- To design and implement meaningful projects and activities tailored to tackle specific cultural and social barriers identified through consultation with the international communities.
- To promote peaceful, collaborative, safe, representative, and culturally inclusive practices based on ongoing consultations with the international communities in Cluj.

VALUES

Cluj International Council's structure and work are based on the following values:

- Respect** for different cultures, races, ethnicities, religions, and genders. We consider diversity as the main engine of social transformation, equal opportunity practices, and democratic processes.
- Collaboration** with local, regional, national, and international stakeholders, migrant-led bodies and organizations, and public institutions. We believe that inclusive societies can be developed through open dialogue, the exchange of good practices, and joint efforts of all the relevant stakeholders.
- Human rights** awareness, promotion, and protection. We believe that we need to be advocates of human rights in all aspects, as they are the foundation of truly democratic and fair societies.

We are who we are because of each other.

OUR VISION

The Cluj International Council is now in the process of being formally and legally registered as a non-governmental, not-for-profit, independent, and apolitical organization.

A European initiative happening in 7 countries (Romania, Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Greece, France, Italy), the Cluj International Council is endorsed in Cluj/Romania by the Romanian Peace Institute - PATRIR, an outstanding organization promoting peace, conflict resolution, human rights, civic participation, and gender equality, since 2001.

The Cluj International Council is a unique initiative, being the first organization in Romania fully dedicated to and led by international citizens, focused on promoting and advocating migrant and refugee rights as equal citizens in Romania. The Council will ensure the representation of all the international communities in Cluj, through a participative, horizontal structure, where each community will have the space to propose its own ideas and priorities.

The 5 vice presidents of the Council:

- would have received more than half of the votes cast (valid votes expressed by all the members of the Council),
- will have a 2-years mandate, they can be elected for a maximum of two mandates.

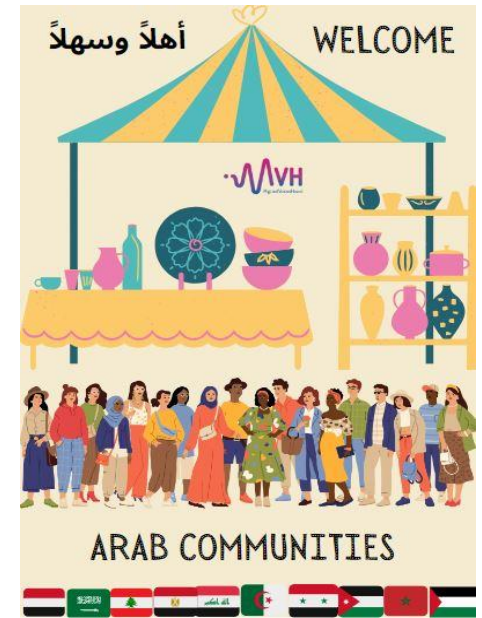
Cultural Fair (May 2023, Cluj Days)

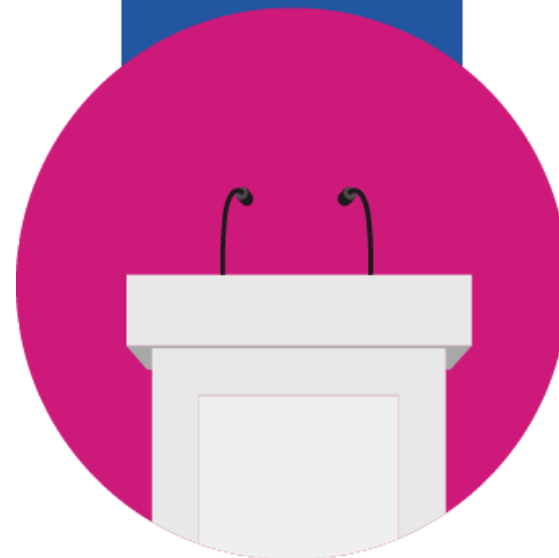
